The family of David & Dena Hickinbotham and their son Alan, have been involved in the Australian wine industry for nearly 80 years. In 1936, David's grandfather Alan Robb Hickinbotham helped establish the highly respected winemaking course at Roseworthy Agricultural College in South Australia where he taught young, upcoming winemakers and subsequent industry leaders and is regarded the father of Australian professional winemaking education.

Alan Robb and the family began growing grapes in 1971 in South Australia and in 1999, Paringa was established as the family brand. Paringa was one of the first high quality, value-priced Australian wines to obtain a 90 point rating from the Wine Spectator, with both the 2000 Paringa Cabernet Sauvignon and the 2001 Paringa Shiraz appeared on their front cover and selected in the Wine Spectator Top 100 list for 2002. Since its inception, the Paringa wine range, all produced from family vineyards, has achieved numerous "Best Buy" nominations from Wine Spectator, Wine Enthusiast and the Wine Advocate.
