




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The Douro


- 576 miles -TOTAL EXTENSION
- 132 miles – IN PORTUGAL
- 62 miles – DEMARCATED REGION
- 43 miles – BETWEEN RÉGUA AND PORTO






History of the Region

- 3,000 – 4,000 A.C. | The first traces of vineyards
- Century I D.C. | Roman occupation of the Iberian Peninsula
- Middle Ages | The first terraces built for cultivating crops like wheat and corn
- 1675 | The first documented reference to Port Wine
- 1756 | Marquês de Pombal created the first demarcated and regulated wine region in the world – The Douro
- 1863 | The Phylloxera Epidemic
- May 8th, 1986 | The demarcated region was first authorized to directly bottle and commercialize wines.




The Soil

- Northern Portugal features granite soils
- The Douro is the only region where schist-clay soils are found (617,750 acres)
- 98,850 of them are planted with vineyards in schist-predominant soils
- More than 50% of which have inclinations over 30%



The Climate

- Very cold winters and very hot, dry summers
- The Serra do Marão and Montemuro mountain ranges serve as a barrier to the humid western and cold northern winds
- Numerous microclimates exist throughout the region



The Grape Varieties

- More than 100 referenced varieties in the Douro Demarcated Region.
- The 5 primary red varieties include:
 - Tinta Roriz
 - Tinta Barroca
 - Tinto Cão
 - Touriga Nacional
 - Touriga Franca
- Some lesser-known examples include:
 - Esgana-Cão
 - Tinto Bastardinho
 - Borrado das Moscas
 - Casculho
 - Cornifesto
 - Preto Martinho
 - Patorra
 - Caramela



Tradition

- Originated in 1716, making it one of the oldest and most famous in the Douro Valley
- Belonged to the legendary Dona Antónia Adelaide Ferreira and remains in the family's possession
- Situated on both margins of the Corgo river, near the mouth of the Douro river
- 172 acres of vineyards
- Produced Port wine exclusively for the first 200 years, commercialized by Casa Ferreira that belonged to the family





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Current History

- 1987 | Sale of Casa Ferreira
- 1995 | Beginning of Quinta do Vallado's brand with a focus on 'dry' red and white wines
- Today' vineyard holdings represented by:
 - 136 acres of vineyards aged 25 – 30 years
 - 24 acres of vineyards with average age of 100 years.
 - 35ha of organic vineyards in the Superior Douro
- Current Managers:
 - João Ferreira Alvares Ribeiro
 - Francisco Ferreira
 - Francisco Olazabal (winemaker)
- 2009 | New winery is complete

Vineyards

160 acres of vineyards

- Schist soils
- Facing South and West
- Optimal maturation of the grapes
- Mediterranean climate

135 acres – new vineyards (25-30 y.o)

- Replanted in the 90's
- Planted in terraces (patamares)
- Separated grape varieties (block planted)

24 acres - Field Blend old vineyards

- Continuous disposition
- Separation of 1,2m (rows) by 1m (vines)
- Planted following the contours of the slope
- More than 40 grape varieties

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




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Winery

In 2009, construction was completed on the gravity-fed winery, equipped with state-of-the-art technology and capacity for over 264,000 gallons in production.

Aging Cellar

Along with the 2009 construction, a new aging cellar was built:

- Semi-subterranean
- Capacity for 1000 barriques
- Perfect conditions for temperature and humidity control

For 16 to 20 months, the best wines age in French oak casks, where they gain the taste, tannins, and aromas conferred by the oak

The casks come from the Seguin Moreau, François Frères and Taransaud cooperages
