"...Powerful and deep, this unevolved young LBV is a mini-Vintage Port. It has power to spare, a big finish and plenty of flavor. The purity of fruit that typically shows on Vallado's Ruby-family Ports is evident here too, as the stainless-steel treatment makes a difference in style. It starts with enticing aromatics, led off by a hint of eucalyptus, becomes richer and delicious, and then shuts down. A couple of days later, it was still unevolved and a little more alcoholic. Lay this down for a year or two, preferably and at least, to let it come together better. It should age brilliantly. It's a star in structure. All we need to see now is more development of the fruit while it holds its balance. Let's be conservative in evaluation today."
