94 – JAMES SUCKLING, March 2024

"Fragrant nose of dark chocolate, blueberries, rosemary, orange and purple plums. It's full-bodied and well-structured, with a fine yet firm tannin frame. Deep and fragrant. Lots of life ahead. Drink from 2025."

2020

• **94 – JAMES SUCKLING**, April 4, 2023

"A deep and complex malbec with plenty of creamy oak. Lots of mocha, pinecones and fresh, peppery blackberries to the nose. The full-bodied palate has lots to offer with powerful, chalky tannins and a long, spicy finish. Creamy at the end. Drinkable now, but better in two to three years."

• 93 – VINOUS, June 2023

"The 2020 Gran Corte IV Generación is 45% Malbec, 30% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20% Merlot and 5% Petit Verdot from Los Chacayes in the Uco Valley and was aged for 12 months in French oak barrels in 30% new oak. The balsamic nose delivers blackberry, dried plum, camphor, and menthol over oak aromas. Indulgent and faintly chalky on the palate, the structured tannins and bold expression produce a compact, modern taut mouthfeel. This complex red will develop further in the bottle."

2019

94 – JAMES SUCKLING, March 23, 2022

"This is quite mineral with hot stones, ripe blueberries and scented violets. Rich and concentrated with sweet fruit, yet it remains pretty. A mouthful of dusty tannins goes well with richness. Long and silky. Drink or hold."

96 – VINOUS, September 2022

"The 2019 Gran Corte IV Generación is a blend of 60% Malbec, 35% Cabernet Sauvignon and 5% Merlot from Los Chacayes, Uco Valley and was aged for 12 months in a third new barrels. A vivid purple in the glass. The layered nose delivers notes of blackberry, cherry, plum, mountain herbs and black tea with aromas from the aging process providing context and complexity. Free-flowing in the mouth, the tannins are finely grained and juicy with precise freshness. The palate is structured without getting overbearing, filling the mouth with flavor before the long, fruity finish. This is a potent red with diaphanous flavor and character of Los Chacayes."
