“This excellent Beaujolais-Villages marries the ripe red berry fruit and healthy tannins of the 2022 vintage with a liveliness that makes it appealing. It has a very solid structure in the long, polished finish. Drink or hold.”

“A light-to medium-bodied red with aromas of ripe cherry, red plum, nutmeg and some bubblegum. Light tannins, bright acidity and a fruity finish. Drink now.”

“A bright and juicy red with plum and cherry character throughout. Medium body, tangy acidity and a crisp finish. Linear and delicious. Drink on release”

2015

“Bright black cherries and some yogurt on the nose follow through to a medium to full body, soft tannins and a juicy finish. Some tile undertone. Quite tannic. Needs a year or two to soften, but some might like the firm mouthfeel now. Try in 2018.”
