“The hamlet of Panzano in Chianti Classico is the most celebrated growing site in the area. The soil and microclimate are major factors in the full-bodied structure of the Sangiovese here, and the wines do very well with some age. This wine is from 2016 and is aging almost perfectly. The nose is earthy with leathery cherry vibes. The tannins are fading into the wine, leaving a grippy yet lithe palate with medium fruit. The finish lingers and lingers.”

“This exudes aromas of grilled figs, dried herbs, sour cherries, walnuts and spices. It’s medium-bodied with savory and spicy components to the fruit, now showing a touch of tertiary complexity. Firm and slightly rough in texture.”

“The Carobbio 2015 Chianti Classico Riserva opens to classic Sangiovese lines with dark fruit, dried cherry, garden soil and pressed blue flowers. The wine offers a generous mid-weight approach with some of the extra fruit saturation and darkness that you might expect of this warm and sunny vintage. Try it with some spinach-filled gnudi, which are Tuscany's gnocchi-like ravioli.”

“Svelte and velvety, the 2013 Chianti Classico Riserva shows generous dark fruit and rich textural finesse. There is an unexpected level of softness here with sweet touches of blue violets and pressed rose. This wine delivers the kind of plush intensity that would make a good match to pork or lamb.”
