

Puisseguin, Saint-Émilion

Nestled between the Puisseguin Saint-Émilion and Montagne Saint-Émilion appellations, Château des Laurets was acquired by Benjamin de Rothschild in 2003. With origins dating back to the 12th century, the estate is situated on south-facing slopes rich in limestone, providing an ideal environment for cultivating Merlot. This remarkable terroir enhances the Merlot's power and complexity, resulting in wines that truly reflect the essence of the Saint-Émilion region.

The estate's flagship wine, Château des Laurets, is a blend of 80% Merlot and 20% Cabernet Franc, reflecting the classic Right-bank style with depth, character, and finesse. Their icon wine, Cuvée Baron Edmond, Sélection Parcellaire, is a 100% Merlot from a 70-year-old, 10-acre plot, made only in the best vintages, known for its elegance and complexity. The estate also features a stunning 19th-century château with a distinctive octagonal tower.
